

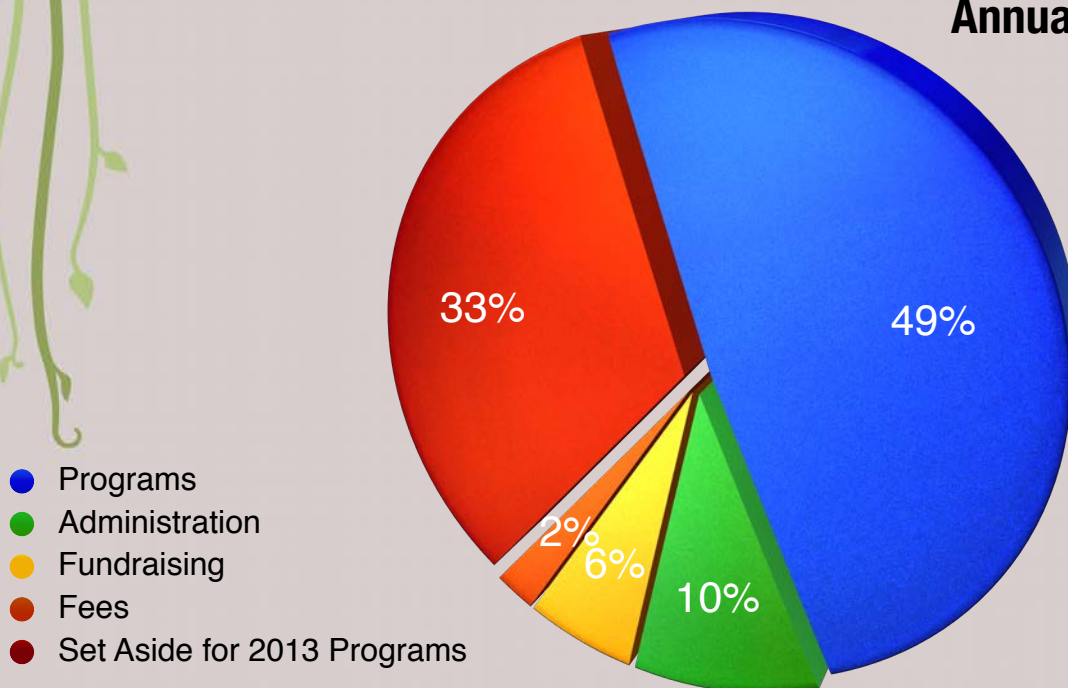

This past year saw a significant reduction in the support needs of the Doi Muser Home as they began to provide more for themselves, both through businesses and through savings brought by having a permanent home to live in rent free, collecting rain water, gardening, etc. Our goal is to help them reach full financial independence by the end of 2013. them after that in teaching and training, developing education programs for the kids and staff, and helping the children to start their own businesses as they grow ready to leave the home and strike out on their own.

Our CEO Aaron Blue and his family have moved to Thailand and will be on hand to support the continued growth and independence of our leaders and community projects in Doi Muser, and to work with the people in these 2 projects build the educational tools we need to replicate this model around the world.
